- On Thursday, April 14, 2005 at approximately 7:05 P.M. this officer was at [REDACTED] Hyannis, the residence of Christopher M. McCowen. At that time McCOWEN was placed under arrest on a warrant issued earlier that date by the Barnstable Superior Court, charging him with Murder.
- Following his arrest McCOWEN was secured in the rear of an unmarked Massachusetts State Police cruiser. Sergeant William Burke, Massachusetts State Police Detectives, then drove the cruiser to the State Police Barracks in South Yarmouth. I was seated with McCOWEN in the rear of the cruiser. I explained to McCOWEN that he had been placed under arrest for a Murder warrant and that the warrant stemmed from the Christa Worthington homicide investigation. McCOWEN stated that he remembered speaking with me previously about the case. I advised McCowen that I would like to speak to him about the case and review his previous statements. I then verbally advised McCOWEN of his Rights per Miranda and informed him that upon our arrival at SP-South Yarmouth I would provide him with a written copy and waiver of those rights, as well as a consent form regarding the electronic recording of any interview. McCowen stated that he understood his Miranda rights and would speak with us. I then advised McCOWEN that I did not want to discuss the case until he had executed the written Miranda waiver and made a decision regarding the recording of the interview.
- Upon our arrival at SP-South Yarmouth, McCOWEN was taken directly into the conference room located on the first floor of the barracks. McCOWEN was uncuffed and seated at the conference room table with myself and Sgt. Burke. I then provided McCOWEN with a printed copy of the Miranda Rights Form. In presence of Sgt. Burke, I read McCOWEN his Miranda rights and waiver from the form. McCOWEN

stated he understood his rights and at 7:32 P.M. signed the waiver of Miranda rights form. I also advised McCOWEN that I was seeking his consent to electronically record the interview. I then provided McCOWEN with a form to indicate his consent to do so. McCOWEN stated that he did not want to be recorded and indicated so on the form. McCOWEN then asked me if he would "look like an [REDACTED] if he did not want to be recorded. I advised McCOWEN that the courts preferred to have the interview recorded to ensure accuracy and that I would not provide him with advise as to what decision to make as the decision was his to make. McCOWEN again stated that he did not want the interview recorded and signed the waiver form. I then advised McCOWEN that he had a right to a telephone call within an hour of his arrival and a right to to immediate medical attention should he require it. McCOWEN stated that he did not have any medical issues and that he would like to call his girlfriend later. McCOWEN stated he wanted to answer my questions right away and straighten everything out. I advised McCOWEN to let me know when he wanted to place his call.

4. I then explained to McCOWEN that he was under arrest on a warrant charging him with the murder of Christa Worthington and that I wanted to speak with him about that and about some of the things that he had previously told me. I asked McCOWEN if he recalled speaking with me on two occasions before. McCOWEN stated that he did. I asked McCOWEN if he recalled telling me about a [REDACTED] McCOWEN stated that he did and explained that [REDACTED] was a driver at Cape Cod Disposal. I asked McCOWEN if he recalled telling me twice that he had never been inside WORTHINGTON's home. McCOWEN stated that he did and that was true. I then asked McCOWEN if he had ever been in WORTHINGTON's home for any reason. McCOWEN stated that he had never been in WORTHINGTON's home. McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON would sometimes come to the window of her front door and that sometimes he would see WORTHINGTON's daughter at the front door. I asked McCOWEN if he ever removed trash from the inside of WORTHINGTON's home and he stated that he had not. McCOWEN stated that he may have collected a bag of trash from WORTHINGTON's front porch once, but had never been in the house.

5. I asked McCOWEN if he had ever spoken with WORTHINGTON, either while on duty or off duty. McCOWEN stated he had never spoken with her at all, saying, "I don't hold conversations with her." I asked McCOWEN if he knew any other people or co workers that may have spoken with WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated that he did not. McCOWEN stated that [REDACTED] took over his trash route when

he (McCOWEN) lost his drivers license. McCOWEN said he did not know what if any relationship [REDACTED] had with WORTHINGTON.

6. I explained to McCOWEN that some of the people that I had interviewed during the course of the investigation had told me that WORTHINGTON could at times be a flirt or throw off a vibe which led them to believe she was interested in them. I asked McCOWEN if WORTHINGTON had ever flirted with him or given him any indication that she was interested in him. McCOWEN stated that he knew what I was getting at and said he did not think of WORTHINGTON as [REDACTED]. McCOWEN then stated he had never heard anything about WORTHINGTON's reputation. McCOWEN then told me that he had [REDACTED] "around" with other women on his trash route, but that WORTHINGTON had never been one of those people.

7. McCOWEN stated that while he worked at Cape Cod Disposal he had a girlfriend named [REDACTED]. McCOWEN stated that [REDACTED] had lived in Truro in the past and that she had rented a home in Truro at one point. McCOWEN stated that [REDACTED], the owner of Cape Cod Disposal, had rented a home to McCOWEN. I asked McCOWEN where the Truro rental was and he described it as past Dutra's Market on Rt. 6A and left at "the crazy house" on the right with all the lawn ornaments. McCOWEN stated that HORTON's stepdaughter, [REDACTED], rented the home to he and [REDACTED]. McCOWEN stated that he had slept with other women while he was dating [REDACTED].

8. I asked McCOWEN where [REDACTED] was today. McCOWEN stated that he thought [REDACTED] was in jail at the "Weymouth Jail" and that the last he knew [REDACTED] was living in Taunton. McCOWEN stated that [REDACTED] was in jail for credit card fraud. I asked McCOWEN if he ever discussed WORTHINGTON with [REDACTED] or other co-workers. McCOWEN stated that although they had talked about girls on the trash route, WORTHINGTON never came up. McCOWEN then stated that WORTHINGTON was not his type. I asked McCOWEN what his "type" was. McCOWEN stated that he liked "big girls with meat on their bones." McCOWEN then offered that he did not know if WORTHINGTON even dated black men and that he did not know what she liked. McCOWEN then added that he "thought" that WORTHINGTON dated Portuguese men. I asked McCOWEN why he thought that, McCOWEN explained that he had Portuguese friends and that by looking at WORTHINGTON's daughter he could tell she had a Portuguese father.

9. I asked McCOWEN what else he thought or knew about WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated that he thought WORTHINGTON was "a high class lady" and pointed to the fact that she lived on a large wooded piece of land. McCOWEN said that he heard that the WORTHINGTON's used to own "all of that land". I asked McCOWEN how he knew that and when he learned it. McCOWEN said that "everybody" told him that. I asked him to try and remember who specifically had told him about the WORTHINGTON's. McCOWEN stated that his friend [REDACTED] had done some plumbing at CHRISTA WORTHINGTON's house and that he was one of the people that had told him. McCOWEN stated that he knew this information about the WORTHINGTON's before the time of the murder. I asked McCOWEN who else told him about the WORTHINGTON's. McCOWEN stated that he had heard about WORTHINGTON from people at work, [REDACTED] and "people on the street". When I asked McCOWEN to provide names of other people he had spoken to about WORTHINGTON he could not recall any. McCOWEN stated that it was just information in general and it was just like how he knew about "Tony Chop Chop". McCOWEN stated that he has met a lot of people in the Truro area through his work and as a doorman at Rick's Outerbar.

10. I asked McCOWEN to tell me more about his discussions with [REDACTED] regarding WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated that he had learned of the murder through [REDACTED]. McCOWEN stated that both he and [REDACTED] had worked at WORTHINGTON's home and recognized her name when the murder was reported in the news. McCOWEN stated that [REDACTED]'s mother had told [REDACTED] about the murder, who in turn told him. McCOWEN stated that he has spoken with [REDACTED] about the murder since it was discovered and that he even told [REDACTED] that he had been spoken to by the police. McCOWEN stated that [REDACTED] is married with two kids. I asked McCOWEN if [REDACTED] had ever expressed any interest in WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN laughed and said that [REDACTED] was not a "ladies man".

11. McCOWEN stated that after the murder, [REDACTED] stopped the trash pickup at WORTHINGTON's house and that he has not been to the house since his last pick up. McCOWEN stated that he did pick up the trash on the Thursday before WORTHINGTON was found and that would have been his last pickup at the residence.

12. I asked McCOWEN again if he had any contact with WORTHINGTON beyond simply picking up the trash at her residence. McCOWEN said, "I can honestly say seriously, I didn't know her." McCOWEN said that WORTHINGTON was an "acquaintance" from work and that he did not "associate with her".

13. I explained to McCOWEN that the reason I was asking him about his relationship with WORTHINGTON was that he was young, in good shape and that he seemed to be charming in a way that a woman might find attractive. McCOWEN stated that he was not a "ladies man" and that "I always do my own thing. I'm always where I'm at." I asked McCOWEN what he meant. McCOWEN stated that if I asked around everyone would tell me that he (McCOWEN) stayed at home and stayed out of trouble. I asked McCOWEN what type of person he thought could have committed this crime. McCOWEN stated that he did not know. I then asked McCOWEN what he thought this person must have been thinking when he did this crime. McCOWEN stated that the guy that did this must have been drunk or stupid. I asked McCOWEN why he thought that. McCOWEN stated that the police in Key West had called him a smart criminal and that if he had done it he would make sure the kid did not see anything and that WORTHINGTON was alone. I asked McCOWEN about the DNA evidence recovered from the body. McCOWEN said that was another thing that showed the guy was stupid.

14. I then explained to McCOWEN that the reason I kept asking about his relationship with WORTHINGTON was due to a DNA report I had received from the Crime Lab. I then gave McCOWEN the DNA report dated April 13, 2005 and explained to him that the report concluded that his DNA was present on the body of CHRISTA WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN looked at the report and after approximately one minute stated, "It could've been me." I asked McCOWEN what he meant and how it could have been him. McCOWEN stated that he was now recalling that he had been extremely intoxicated that weekend, but did not remember having had sex or being in Truro. McCOWEN conceded that he could have had sex with WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated that he did not think he would have gone to Truro if he were that drunk because he was afraid to drive through Wellfleet if he had been drinking. I asked McCOWEN how he could explain the presence of his DNA on the body of CHRISTA WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated that he couldn't remember. I explained to McCOWEN that contact between two people can result in an exchange of DNA and it was clear to me that he was in contact with WORTHINGTON.

15. I then asked McCOWEN what he could remember about that evening. McCOWEN explained that

Friday and Saturday nights are his party nights. McCOWEN stated that he would have gone out that night. I asked McCOWEN what night he was talking about. McCOWEN said "A Friday night." I asked McCOWEN to recall his movements and actions of that Friday night. McCOWEN stated that on that Friday night he would have been home at [REDACTED] before going out. McCOWEN stated that on Friday's he usually leaves work early and would have been home sometime before 4:00 P.M. McCOWEN stated that he would have gone out, leaving [REDACTED] and his daughter at [REDACTED]. I asked McCOWEN where he went from there. McCOWEN said that he usually goes to Rick's Outerbar, The Beach Break, or to Orleans. I asked McCOWEN who he would have been with. McCOWEN stated that he usually goes out with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. McCOWEN stated that they all usually go to an "after party" when the bars close.

16. I then asked McCOWEN who he was with on Friday, January 04, 2002. McCOWEN stated, "The last I can remember I was with Jeremy Fraizer and I was piss ass drunk at the Juice Bar". McCOWEN stated that he had called his "baby's mother" in Dennis and that he and JEREMY left the Juice Bar to visit her in Dennis. McCOWEN stated that JEREMY was driving and that JEREMY drove a gray Eclipse at the time. McCOWEN identified his "baby's mother" as [REDACTED]. McCOWEN stated that he and JEREMY visited [REDACTED] in Dennis for "about half an hour" and then both returned to the Juice Bar in Orleans. McCOWEN stated that JEREMY drove them back to the Juice Bar in his vehicle. McCOWEN stated that he was "already lit" when he got to the Juice Bar and described the night as a "good night" which meant he was drinking "hard". McCOWEN stated that he drank until he blacked out that evening. McCOWEN then stated, "I don't remember having sex with this lady." I asked McCOWEN what he did remember and McCOWEN stated he remembered waking up the next morning fine, not hung over at his [REDACTED] address.

17. I asked McCOWEN how much he had to drink that evening. McCOWEN stated that he had been drinking Alize', which he described as a strong cognac. McCOWEN stated that he remembered buying Alize' at the Windmill Liquor Store in Orleans that evening. McCOWEN stated that he remembered that there was a rap contest at the Juice Bar that evening. McCOWEN stated that he drank outside the Juice Bar as it is an underage club that does not serve alcohol. McCOWEN stated that he remembered drinking heavily that evening and waking up at his house in the morning. I asked McCOWEN how he got home that evening and McCOWEN stated that JEREMY took him home. I asked McCOWEN if he ever asked JEREMY what they

did that evening. McCOWEN stated that he has never spoken to JEREMY about that evening. I asked McCOWEN who was home when he arrived at [REDACTED]. McCOWEN stated that [REDACTED] and his daughter were there. McCOWEN explained that on Saturday he did not work and would have just hung around his house. I asked McCOWEN again if he ever had a conversation with JEREMY about what had happened that evening or about CHRISTA WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated that he had not.

18. I asked McCOWEN when he and JEREMY met on Friday night. McCOWEN was uncertain how or where he and JEREMY met, but stated that they would have probably met around 9:00 to 10:00 P.M. I asked McCOWEN when he started to black out that evening. McCOWEN stated that on a "out to a club night" he wouldn't get [REDACTED] drunk until 12:00 or 2:00 A.M. McCOWEN then stated that he may have been drinking Remy Martin and not Alize that evening. I asked McCOWEN when was the last time he drank to blackout. McCOWEN stated that he drank to blackout approximately two (2) weeks ago when he and a co-worker, [REDACTED] went to Jack's Lounge on West Main Street in Hyannis. McCOWEN stated that he drank four (4) Corona beers and three and one half Remy Martin shots and was "tore up". McCOWEN stated that he and [REDACTED] left Jack's and went to his house where he changed clothes. McCOWEN stated that after going home everything that happened that evening was a blackout. McCOWEN said that [REDACTED] later told him that he (McCOWEN) gave [REDACTED] \$40.00 dollars to drive to Zachary's Pub in Mashpee. McCOWEN stated that [REDACTED] told him later that he had passed out in the car and then threw up in the car. McCOWEN stated that he remembered none of this on his own as he had blacked out.

19. I asked McCOWEN how many times in his life he had blacked out from drinking. McCOWEN stated twice. McCOWEN stated that he had blacked out approximately two weeks ago with [REDACTED] and that the other occasion was on the weekend of CHRISTA WORTHINGTON's murder. I asked McCOWEN to try and remember what had occurred to him on that Friday evening that he had blacked out. McCOWEN told me, "Honestly, I don't know. How do you want me to remember anything." McCOWEN stated that after the second visit to the Juice Bar he blacked out. I told McCOWEN that often times recalling one small event will trigger a recollection of the rest of the events surrounding it and encouraged him to do so. McCOWEN bowed his head and stated, "Ya, I had sex." I asked McCOWEN who he had sex with. McCOWEN stated, "Fine, I had sex with her." I asked McCOWEN if he was referring to CHRISTA WORTHINGTON and he stated that he was. I asked McCOWEN what he could tell me about that. McCOWEN stated he did not remember everything that happened that evening but did know that he had sex with WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN

stated, "Anything could have happened. I know I didn't kill her." McCOWEN then stated that he could not even remember how he got home that evening. McCOWEN stated that he was "piss ass drunk" that evening. I told McCOWEN that he said that JEREMY brought him home and McCOWEN said, "That sounds right."

20. McCOWEN then stated, "If I was going to do some stupid [REDACTED] I would be a smart criminal". McCOWEN then offered that he would be sure that "she would be there by herself and her kid wasn't there to see this [REDACTED]" McCOWEN stated that he had read or heard somewhere that the door at the WORTHINGTON house had been kicked in. McCOWEN stated that he would not have done that. McCOWEN stated that his "forte" was sex not kicking in doors.

21. The time at this point in the interview was approximately 20:30 hours and I reminded McCOWEN he could use the phone. McCOWEN waved his hand and stated, "I can make it later." McCOWEN asked if he could get a cigarette and when I asked which brand he wanted. McCOWEN asked for Newports.

22. I asked McCOWEN to try to remember what happened that Friday evening. McCOWEN said he could not "kick his brain" because he had been drunk. McCOWEN then stated, "Anyone who's going to do a crime is going to do it all the way." I asked McCOWEN what he meant. McCOWEN stated, "It's black and white. I never kicked anyone's door. If I get turned away for sex, I just leave. I never took her phone or wallet." I asked McCOWEN how he knew the phone and wallet were missing. McCOWEN stated that he had read about it in the paper and that he would have used credit cards if he took them and that "credit cards can tell a lot." McCOWEN stated that his friend [REDACTED] was in jail for using credit cards. McCOWEN stated, "A piece of [REDACTED] is different, stealing is [REDACTED]" I asked McCOWEN who had called him a "smart criminal". McCOWEN stated that when he lived in Key West there was a Detective Benlow(sp?) who had called him a smart criminal. McCOWEN stated that Det. Benlow told him he was smart and had wanted McCOWEN to give him information on a Burglary he was investigating.

23. I told McCOWEN that he was smart and I was sure he could focus on the evening of Friday, January 04, 2002. McCOWEN stated that he could not remember what happened on that Friday night or two weeks ago when he also blacked out. McCOWEN stated that everyone at work was "[REDACTED] with me" and that they could confirm he did not remember what happened when he blacked out. I told McCOWEN that he

had spoken with [REDACTED] about what happened when he blacked out and asked why had he not spoken with JEREMY about what happened. McCOWEN stated that he has not seen or spoken to JEREMY since that evening.

24. McCOWEN stated that it was going to "waste of time" trying to remember what happened and suggested that I check out his "alibis". I asked McCOWEN what his alibi was. McCOWEN stated that I could talk to [REDACTED], JEREMY FRAZIER and [REDACTED]. I asked McCOWEN who else I could speak with to reconstruct his activities that weekend. McCOWEN stated that on Saturday he awoke at home and later may have gone to play basketball with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] at Eastham High School. McCOWEN stated that he would have also spent time that weekend hanging out at home and smoking weed.

25. I told McCOWEN it was clear to me that he remembered having sex with CHRISTA WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated that he didn't and the fact that he gave a swab proved that. McCOWEN stated, "Who wouldn't. Look at all the men in Truro that are giving it. If I was to do something, I might not, but I didn't."

26. At this point in the interview, approximately 8:51 P.M., Lt. Robert Melia provided McCOWEN with pack of Newport cigarettes which he was allowed to smoke.

27. McCOWEN was then asked to recount again where he went Friday evening. McCOWEN stated that he and JEREMY went to the Juice Bar and then to Dennis, via back roads. After visiting [REDACTED] in Dennis, McCOWEN stated that he and JEREMY went back to the Juice Bar. McCOWEN stated that he started having a hard time remembering things during the ride back to the Juice Bar. McCOWEN stated that he remembered being in JEREMY's car after he left the Juice Bar for the second time because JEREMY has a loud bass sound system in his car and he could remember the noise of the bass speaker. McCOWEN stated that he remembered that JEREMY stopped at a store because McCOWEN said he could remember stumbling as he was getting out of the car. McCOWEN stated that both he and JEREMY went into the store to buy cigarettes. McCOWEN stated that he remembered getting back in the car because the bass noise started up again. McCOWEN stated that when the car stopped next, he got out, "not noticing where I'm at." McCOWEN said, "If we went to that house.....One of us would have knocked on the door."

McCOWEN stated, "If we were having sex I wouldn't know what Jeremy was doing." McCOWEN stated that ride after getting cigarettes seemed longer than the time it should take to get home to Eastham or Wellfleet so maybe they were in Truro.

28. I asked McCOWEN where he was and what his reaction was when he heard that WORTHINGTON had been murdered. McCOWEN stated that he learned on Sunday at approximately 12:30 P.M. or 1:00 P.M. and that he "freaked out" when he heard of the murder. McCOWEN stated that everyone was "up in arms" because this was a murder and that does not happen in Truro. McCOWEN stated that he went to work on Monday and that [REDACTED] asked him that day if he had ever had sex with WORTHINGTON before. I asked McCOWEN what he said and McCOWEN stated he told [REDACTED], "You [REDACTED] crazy." McCOWEN stated that also present during that exchange were [REDACTED] and the [REDACTED]. I asked McCOWEN why [REDACTED] had asked him that question. McCOWEN stated that [REDACTED] probably knew that he has slept with women on his route before. I asked McCOWEN if he ever had sex with WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated that he had never had sex with WORTHINGTON other than on that Friday night. McCOWEN then offered that he had even slept with a woman on his route the day he was first interviewed in 2002. I asked McCOWEN again if he ever had sex with WORTHINGTON other than that Friday evening. McCOWEN stated that he had not.

29. I asked McCOWEN to go back to Friday evening and to tell me how it came to be that he was at WORTHINGTON's house having sex with her. McCOWEN stated that he and JEREMY went to the Juice Bar and then to Dennis and then back to the Juice Bar and then "[REDACTED] happened." I explained to McCOWEN that the "[REDACTED] happened" part was what I was interested in. McCOWEN stated that since he had sex with WORTHINGTON maybe JEREMY would have done the same thing. McCOWEN pointed out that he was not suggesting that JEREMY did the murder. I then told McCOWEN that there was no evidence of FRAZIER having had sex with WORTHINGTON and that it was his DNA which had been recovered from WORTHINGTON's body.

30. I asked McCOWEN what had happened after he had sex with WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated that he couldn't remember, but he knew that JEREMY had been with him and that JEREMY had driven him home. I asked McCOWEN if he had any arguments with WORTHINGTON while he was at her house. McCOWEN stated, "I wouldn't waste my time". McCOWEN stated that if someone told him they were not

interested in sex then he was "fine with that." McCOWEN also said "If we're going to have sex were going to do it, no if ands or butts...but if its no sex, fine." I reminded McCOWEN that he had already stated that he had sex with WORTHINGTON and that "if" he had sex with her was no longer an issue. McCOWEN agreed and stated "No way I can deny it." I told McCOWEN that the other things that happened at WORTHINGTON's house were what I wanted to know about. McCOWEN stated, "That's something beyond me." McCOWEN told me he knew he had sex with someone that night because when he woke up he was sleeping on his couch. McCOWEN stated that his girlfriend KELLY "can smell sex" so he would not have gotten into bed with her after sleeping with another woman. McCOWEN said that seeing the DNA report today was bringing his memory of what had happened and who he slept with that night back to him. McCOWEN stated that he slept on the couch until "12:00 or 1:00 or 2:00" or until his daughter woke him up. McCOWEN said that he did know that JEREMY had also taken him to WORTHINGTON's and had driven him home. McCOWEN stated that he would not have driven through Wellfleet at night because the police stop everyone at night.

31. I asked McCOWEN if JEREMY knew WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated that he did not think JEREMY knew WORTHINGTON, but could not be certain. I told McCOWEN that someone must have come up with the idea to go to WORTHINGTON's and asked if it was his idea. McCOWEN stated that it probably was. I asked McCOWEN what he told JEREMY about going to WORTHINGTON's home. McCOWEN stated that he probably said something like "I know this bitch in Truro who will give up some [REDACTED]" I asked McCOWEN if he probably said that or if that is what he said. McCOWEN stated that was what he said to JEREMY. I asked McCOWEN how JEREMY would have known how to get to WORTHINGTON's. McCOWEN stated that he would have told JEREMY how to go. I told McCOWEN that he was starting to remember and asked him to now tell me what happened when he arrived at WORTHINGTON's.

32. McCOWEN stated that he would have turned the bass down on JEREMY's vehicle and would have directed JEREMY to pull in like he pulls in his garbage truck. McCOWEN then took a piece of paper and drew on it to show me how he drives up the driveway and then backs the garbage truck up to the wooden trash bin so he can pull right out after he empties the trash. See the attached sketch. I asked McCOWEN if he actually did those things he described on Friday night and he stated that he did. McCOWEN stated that when he arrived at WORTHINGTON's he was "still [REDACTED] up". I asked McCOWEN what time it was when he

arrived. McCOWEN stated that he couldn't remember. I asked McCOWEN if it was nighttime and he stated that it was. I asked McCOWEN if WORTHINGTON's daughter was awake. McCOWEN stated "No, What kind of person would have a kid up at that time of night." I then asked McCOWEN if it was late at night when he arrived. McCOWEN stated that it was. McCOWEN then stated, "If I knew her daughter was up it would be a bad time." McCOWEN then stated that evening was the first time he had ever been in WORTHINGTON's house. McCOWEN stated that once he thought he may have picked up a trash bag that was on her porch. I asked McCOWEN to describe the interior of WORTHINGTON's house. McCOWEN stated, "There was a lot of [REDACTED] everywhere. If I remember correctly, when I walked in the house I was staggering and weaving and all of that." McCOWEN then stated, "I guess we had sex right there." I asked McCOWEN where "there" was. McCOWEN stated by the kitchen was a hallway area and that was where they had sex. McCOWEN then added that he and WORTHINGTON may have had sex in the living room or in another room he described as an office. McCOWEN described the kitchen area as leading into a hallway, with an office on the right and "some table" on the left in the hallway. McCOWEN then took a piece of paper and wrote out a sketch, which depicted the interior of the WORTHINGTON residence as he recalled it. See attached diagram. I asked McCOWEN what was behind the two doors he drew and McCOWEN stated that he did not know. McCOWEN stated that there was a staircase leading upstairs and that there were so many things on the stairs you could not even get upstairs. McCOWEN tapped the diagram as he described the stairs. I asked McCOWEN if it was his recollection that the date was January 04, 2002. McCOWEN stated that he did not know the date, but knew it was a Friday and that it was after Christmas. McCOWEN explained that he knew it was after Christmas because he spoke with WORTHINGTON, that evening in her home, about getting rid of the Christmas tree. McCOWEN then added the location of the Christmas tree on his diagram.

33. I asked McCOWEN what happened after he and WORTHINGTON discussed the Christmas tree. McCOWEN stated, "I [REDACTED] the [REDACTED] out her... I don't know..." McCOWEN stated that if JEREMY went back to WORTHINGTON's later in the evening and did something that was "on him". I asked McCOWEN what he thought happened. McCOWEN stated, "It doesn't bother me to talk to ya'll, but I can only tell ya what I remember." I asked McCOWEN where he thought the sex happened. McCOWEN stated "One or the other. Office or living room. Had to be on the floor." I asked McCOWEN if he had used a condom. McCOWEN stated that neither he or JEREMY had condoms with them. I asked McCOWEN if WORTHINGTON had mentioned anything about birth control. McCOWEN stated, "She didn't bring out any condoms." I asked McCOWEN how he knew that JEREMY did not have any condoms. McCOWEN stated

that he didn't know. I asked McCOWEN if he had asked JEREMY if he had any condoms that night. McCOWEN stated that he had not.

34. McCOWEN then explained that if he and JEREMY were going out to meet girls they would usually get a pack of condoms and that they had not done that this night. McCOWEN stated that if WORTHINGTON had wanted him to use a condom he would, because she was not some [REDACTED]. I asked McCOWEN what he meant. McCOWEN [REDACTED] and said that a [REDACTED] was girl that would be willing to climb into his truck and [REDACTED]. I asked McCOWEN if he had ever heard anyone say anything that would lead him to believe that WORTHINGTON was available sexually. McCOWEN stated that he had not. McCOWEN said he had only seen one man at WORTHINGTON's house before and that he was a white male approximately 6 feet 2 inches and "chunky in the stomach". I asked McCOWEN if he had ever seen a picture of this man in any of the news accounts he had read and he stated that he had not. McCOWEN stated that the man was older and then joked with Sgt. Burke that the man was old like you. McCOWEN stated that he estimated Sgt. Burke to be 55 or 56, or about his fathers age.

35. I asked McCOWEN about the sex that he he had with WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN said that if he had sex it was late that he wouldn't stay, but instead would go back to [REDACTED]. I corrected McCOWEN and pointed out that he used the word "if". McCOWEN laughed and corrected himself saying "After I had sex with her. I went home" I asked McCOWEN what else happened. McCOWEN said WORTHINGTON was "cool" with everything after they had sex and that he even gave WORTHINGTON his number. I asked McCOWEN what WORTHINGTON had written down the number on so I could look for it. McCOWEN then stated that he was not sure if WORTHINGTON wrote the number down at all. I asked McCOWEN what number he gave WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated that he could not recall, but that it was his cell phone number at the time which was in his name and billed to [REDACTED] in Eastham, MA. McCOWEN stated that it was a Nokia phone. I asked McCOWEN what he remembered about the house phone at WORTHINGTON's house. McCOWEN stated, "I'm not seeing a house phone and I'm not seeing her daughter." McCOWEN stated that he would have remember using or handling the house phone in WORTHINGTON's house.

36. I asked McCOWEN what time he thought it was when he had arrived at WORTHINGTON's house. McCOWEN stated that he thought that he and JEREMY left Orleans to go to Truro at about 12:30

A.M. to 1:00 A.M. and arrived at WORTHINGTON's house at about 1:15 A.M. to 1:45 A.M. I asked McCOWEN what had happened on the ride out to Truro. McCOWEN stated that he remembered that he and JEREMY stopped at the Mobil Station in Eastham to buy cigarettes. McCOWEN stated that he thinks the clerk working that night was [REDACTED] who described as an older lady. McCOWEN stated that he would have paid in cash as would JEREMY.

37. McCOWEN told me that from the Eastham Mobil Station JEREMY drove to Truro. I asked McCOWEN what happened when he arrived at WORTHINGTON's. McCOWEN stated that everything was "cool" until JEREMY "started going through her [REDACTED]". I asked McCOWEN what he meant and McCOWEN stated "Jerney is the kind of guy that's going through her [REDACTED]". I asked McCOWEN what he meant. McCOWEN stated, "Who wouldn't go through her [REDACTED] if they could." I asked McCOWEN if JEREMY took anything from WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated, "Not that I know of. If he did he's stupid." I asked McCOWEN what WORTHINGTON had been wearing when he arrived at her house. McCOWEN stated he recalled "black sweats". I asked McCOWEN what WORTHINGTON was wearing for footwear and McCOWEN could not recall.

38. I asked McCOWEN what he remembered about the actual sex act with WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated that he and WORTHINGTON had "straight sex". I asked McCOWEN what he meant. McCOWEN stated that he was on top of WORTHINGTON and described penis/vaginal sex. McCOWEN described the sex as "masonry style". McCOWEN stated that the sex did not last long and said, "[REDACTED]". McCOWEN stated that he could not recall any thing about WORTHINGTON's body, such as scars, tattoos, etc. McCOWEN stated that he did not think that WORTHINGTON had been wearing underwear. McCOWEN stated that after sex he and WORTHINGTON stood up from the living room floor, and that he left. I asked McCOWEN if the living room was where he now thought they had sex and McCOWEN stated that it was.

39. I asked McCOWEN where JEREMY was while he and WORTHINGTON were having sex. McCOWEN stated that JEREMY was in the kitchen. I asked McCOWEN what JEREMY was doing and McCOWEN stated that JEREMY was talking on his cell phone and said that JEREMY was always on his cell phone. I asked McCOWEN what was behind each of the doors that he had drawn in his diagram. McCOWEN stated that he knew one room was an office and pointed at it on his diagram and said that he did not know

what was behind the other two doors. McCOWEN stated he never went up the stairs and that "on the steps was a lot of [REDACTED]". McCOWEN stated that he remembered windows or a balcony or "something" along one wall of the living room. McCOWEN stated that he didn't pay a lot attention to what was in each room because he just wanted to "get this done and get the [REDACTED] up".

40. I asked McCOWEN to describe the moments leading up to his having sex with WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated that he said, "Whatever, Whatever and that one thing led to another." I asked McCOWEN what he said and McCOWEN stated "You can say some clever [REDACTED] when your drunk." I asked McCOWEN what had he actually said. McCOWEN stated that he always says, "I won't say nothing if you don't say nothing." I asked McCOWEN if that was what he actually said that night and that McCOWEN stated that it was because "That's the easiest way to get [REDACTED]".

41. I asked McCOWEN what had happened after he had sex with WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated that he and JEREMY left the house and that WORTHINGTON did not follow them out. McCOWEN stated that he and JEREMY got in JEREMY's car and that JEREMY drove him home to Eastham.

42. I had McCOWEN review his arrival at WORTHINGTON's house. McCOWEN stated that when he and JEREMY arrived he told JEREMY how to park and that he and JEREMY went to the door. McCOWEN stated that one of them knocked, but that he could not remember who and that WORTHINGTON invited both of them in. McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON had no contact with JEREMY after they arrived. I asked McCOWEN what JEREMY was doing after they arrived, McCOWEN stated, "Probably just going through her [REDACTED]". McCOWEN explained that he and WORTHINGTON sat in the living room and talked and that JEREMY was talking on his cell phone talking and checking out WORTHINGTON's house. I asked McCOWEN how long he thought he had been in the house and he stated "roughly like one and a half to two hours." McCOWEN then offered that JEREMY may have gone back to WORTHINGTON's house after he dropped McCOWEN off. I asked McCOWEN why he thought JEREMY had gone back. McCOWEN stated that he knew it was only fifteen (15) to twenty (20) minutes on Rt. 6 to get back to WORTHINGTON's house from JEREMY's house. I asked McCOWEN how he and JEREMY had left WORTHINGTON's house and he stated that they took JEREMY's car and that JEREMY had almost lost his muffler where the WORTHINGTON's driveway meets Depot Road.

43. McCOWEN stated that on Saturday night, he, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had gone out. McCOWEN stated that they all went to Rick's and then the Beachbreak and that he did not think there was an after party that evening. On Sunday, McCOWEN stated that he went to [REDACTED] home and that was when he heard of WORTHINGTON's murder. McCOWEN stated that [REDACTED] had mentioned he had done plumbing at WORTHINGTON's house.

44. I asked McCOWEN if he had ever, with the exception of two weeks ago, drank to a point where he blacked out. McCOWEN stated that he had not drunk to black out since the night he was at WORTHINGTON's.

45. Sgt. Burke then told McCOWEN that he believed that McCOWEN had sex with WORTHINGTON, but that his versions of the events were not the truth. Sgt. Burke stated that evidence at the scene led him to believe that there had been a struggle at the scene. I told McCOWEN that there had been grass in WORTHINGTON's hair and that I thought something had happened outside her house. McCOWEN looked at Sgt. Burke and I could see that his eyes were filling with tears. McCOWEN then stated, "I do have regrets of [REDACTED] and I'm sorry she's dead. I don't go around killing people, especially with kids there." McCOWEN also stated, "If I would have killed her, why would I still be on the Cape."

46. McCOWEN then stated that while he was at WORTHINGTON's house there were "No worries" between WORTHINGTON, him or JEREMY. McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON was "startled" when she came to the door of her house. McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON knew his name and that she had never met JEREMY and that he introduced her to him. McCOWEN stated that everything had been "cool" and that the last he saw of WORTHINGTON was when she closed the door as he and JEREMY left. McCOWEN then offered that "If she got into a scuffle outside, then maybe JEREMY went back and she turned him down for sex. I don't go crazy if I get turned down for sex." McCOWEN stated, "If she pissed me off... I would say [REDACTED] you, you sorry piece of [REDACTED] I never let it get to the point where I'd kill."

47. I asked McCOWEN if there was any possibility that WORTHINGTON had tried to start a confrontation at any point in the evening. I told McCOWEN that one of the persons interviewed in this case claimed that WORTHINGTON came at him with a knife. I then asked McCOWEN if that could have

happened. McCOWEN said, "If she had come at me with a knife, I would have beat her ass. How would you look if you just had sex with this lady and she just came at you with a knife?" McCOWEN stated that if he took things from the WORTHINGTON house someone would have found them. I asked McCOWEN what had been taken from the house. McCOWEN stated that he had read or heard that a phone and a wallet had been taken.

48. I told McCOWEN that I thought he was more involved in the death of CHRISTA WORTHINGTON more than he had revealed. I told McCOWEN that I had worked with F.B.I. and that they thought there may have been a misunderstanding between WORTHINGTON and the person responsible for her death. McCOWEN stated that the F.B.I. was "totally wrong". I asked McCOWEN if he had followed the case at all in the press. McCOWEN stated that he had not, but that he knew there was book about it and that the book was controversial. McCOWEN stated that he had read the back of the book cover at the book store, but had not bought the book.

49. I told McCOWEN that I still thought he knew more. McCOWEN stated that although he could not remember having sex with WORTHINGTON the first time I had asked, he now did remember "no problem". McCOWEN stated, "When y'all give the paper, I remembered."

50. I told McCOWEN that I was concerned about his history of domestic violence and if that they may have played a part in what happened at WORTHINGTON's. McCOWEN stated that he is not the type of person who "blows his top". I asked McCOWEN about his domestic with [REDACTED] McCOWEN stated that she [REDACTED] had put her hands on him and that he just pushed her back and then he moved out of her apartment. McCOWEN stated that he was not that kind of person and that women were always getting him into trouble. McCOWEN said, "I know that makes me look like a bad guy."

51. I told McCOWEN that based upon everything I knew about the scene and what he had told me I didn't think he was telling me everything he knew or was being truthful about his actions at the WORTHINGTON house that night. McCOWEN stated, "I'm not that kind of person. I know it makes me look like a bad guy but....". I told McCOWEN that Troopers were going to be speaking with JEREMY in Truro and that I would find out what JEREMY was saying from those Troopers. I then asked McCOWEN what he would say if the other Troopers and I determined that JEREMY was somewhere else on the evening

of the murder. McCOWEN threw his hands up in the air and stated, "Then it's all on me if Jeremy can account for his time." I reminded McCOWEN that he had stated earlier that JEREMY was on his cell phone. I told McCOWEN that one of the things I would try to get were JEREMY's cell phone records and what would he say if those records showed JEREMY to be somewhere other than Truro. McCOWEN said, "There's nothing I can say." I asked McCOWEN to just tell me the truth and that I would not judge him. McCOWEN stated that he had "no problem" with CHRISTA and also said, "If she came after me I would have told you that. I would have told her, 'Listen, we're not dating, we're [REDACTED]'"

52. I told McCOWEN that I was concerned that there had been altercation at WORTHINGTON's house that night and asked McCOWEN if that was possible. McCOWEN stated, "If you hit a women with the right punch, you can do some damage so I wouldn't do that. McCOWEN went on to explain that if WORTHINGTON had come at him he'd just sit on her because he was bigger than her. I asked McCOWEN what he would have done if WORTHINGTON had pushed him. McCOWEN stated that if WORTHINGTON had pushed him he would have pushed back only if he was really mad. McCOWEN stated that none of that happened and if it had then WORTHINGTON would have called the Truro Police.

53. McCOWEN was asked about knives that were recovered from his home. McCOWEN stated that he bought the knives from MARIO PURDUE for five (5) dollars each. McCOWEN stated that one (1) knife was small and yellow and the other was gray. McCOWEN was also asked about vehicles he had access to during the time of the murder. McCOWEN stated that he had a white Nissan 240SX which he lost. I asked McCOWEN how he lost it. McCOWEN stated that the engine blew and the last he knew it was at [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] McCOWEN stated that he did not know where the vehicle was today.

54. At approximately 10:31 P.M. Sgt. Burke told McCOWEN that he felt that McCOWEN had more to say and that he wanted McCOWEN to tell him everything that happened. McCOWEN began to shed tears and stated he didn't rape anyone. McCOWEN stated, "She flipped out on JEREMY and did whatever." Sgt. Burke asked McCOWEN to tell him what happened. McCOWEN stated that JEREMY was "going through her [REDACTED] while he was having sex with WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated, "She saw JEREMEY going through her stuff". McCOWEN stated WORTHINGTON then confronted JEREMY about taking money from her and that he had then asked JEREMY if he had taken anything. McCOWEN stated that JEREMY denied taking anything and that he and JEREMY then left the house. McCOWEN stated that as he and

JEREMY were walking to JEREMY's car, WORTHINGTON was following them and "screaming" at them. McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON was yelling at them about "a phone or a wallet or something." McCOWEN stated that that JEREMY turned suddenly towards WORTHINGTON and "started drilling her". McCOWEN stated that as JEREMY was punching WORTHINGTON he was telling JEREMY, "Lets get the [REDACTED] out of here !". McCOWEN stated that he got in the passenger seat of JEREMY's car and that he could see WORTHINGTON run back into her house and could also see that JEREMY was chasing her. I asked McCOWEN what happened then and he stated that he did not know and said, "She didn't want JEREMY at the house anyway." McCOWEN said, "Whatever he has done, He's done."

55. I told McCOWEN to tell me everything that JEREMY did at the scene. McCOWEN told me that JEREMY was going through WORTHINGTON's [REDACTED] and that he had heard JEREMY banging around the office while he and WORTHINGTON were having sex on the living room floor. McCOWEN said that WORTHINGTON must have also heard JEREMY because after they were done and had gotten dressed, WORTHINGTON confronted JEREMY. I asked McCOWEN if JEREMY had taken anything. McCOWEN stated that he did not know, and further stated that when he asked JEREMY, JEREMY had denied taking any money he told WORTHINGTON, "That's my boy and if he said he didn't take anything, he didn't take anything." McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON had followed them to their car, which was parked just beyond WORTHINGTON's vehicle. McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON was yelling at FRAZIER, calling him an [REDACTED] when JEREMY turned and punched her twice in the face. I asked McCOWEN what WORTHINGTON did and McCOWEN stated, "She was fighting and screaming." McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON then ran to her house and that he and JEREMY began to get into JEREMY's car. McCOWEN stated that he could see that WORTHINGTON at the door with a phone to her ear. McCOWEN stated that he told JEREMY that WORTHINGTON was going to call the police. McCOWEN stated that JEREMY said, [REDACTED] and that JEREMY then ran to the door. McCOWEN stated he watched as JEREMY kicked the door. I asked McCOWEN what he saw next. McCOWEN stated, "They was still going at it." McCOWEN stated that he was thinking of going in the house, but ended up passing out in the car at that point. McCOWEN stated that when JEREMY returned he asked JEREMY what he did. McCOWEN stated that JEREMY told him, "I beat her ass." McCOWEN stated that JEREMY was "huffing and puffing" when he got back to car and was sweaty. McCOWEN stated that he told JEREMY, "Tell me you didn't do something stupid." I asked McCOWEN what JEREMY told him in response and McCOWEN stated that JEREMY didn't say anything.

56. I told McCOWEN that I thought he was using JEREMY to cover things that he had actually done and that he had taken his car to the scene. McCOWEN denied any further involvement other than what he had described and said they had been in JEREMY's car. Sgt. Burke asked McCOWEN if he would consent to a search of his 240SX. McCOWEN stated he didn't know where the vehicle was but that we could search it if we found it. Sgt. Burke then contacted Sgt. Knott who brought in a consent to search form into the conference room which McCOWEN executed at 11:00 P.M. At approximately 11:22 P.M. McCOWEN was offered pizza which was brought into the conference room. McCOWEN declined pizza and had a Coca Cola.

57. I then asked McCOWEN to recall for me the sequence of events with as much detail as possible. I told McCOWEN that I was not convinced that the events were as he had recalled them. McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON had followed him and JEREMY out of her home. McCOWEN stated that he was walking towards JEREMY's car, which he said was parked beyond WORTHINGTON's, facing down the driveway. McCOWEN stated that JEREMY was walking behind him and that WORTHINGTON was behind JEREMY. McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON was arguing with JEREMY and that he was telling them "Knock it off." McCOWEN stated that JEREMY then hit WORTHINGTON "dead in her face twice". McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON then ran to her door and started "bitching" at them. McCOWEN stated that JEREMY then said, "this [REDACTED] I'm just going to do her." and that JEREMY then headed back to the house. McCOWEN stated that JEREMY went inside the house after WORTHINGTON and then came out alone after approximately ten (10) minutes. McCOWEN stated that JEREMY then walked to his car, where McCOWEN had remained seated. McCOWEN stated that JEREMY then turned around and walked back to the house and kicked the front door in. McCOWEN stated, "I think, O.K., fine, he's going to make it look like a burglary". McCOWEN stated that JEREMY then drove him home to [REDACTED]

58. Sgt. Burke asked McCOWEN what conversation he has had with JEREMY about the incident either that night or since. McCOWEN stated that he has never spoken with JEREMY about the incident. I asked McCOWEN if he contacted JEREMY when he learned that WORTHINGTON had been murdered. McCOWEN stated that he had not. I asked McCOWEN if he ever told anyone else about what occurred at WORTHINGTON's. McCOWEN stated he had not. I asked McCOWEN why he gave me a swab, when he knew it was going to match. McCOWEN stated, "At first I didn't remember having sex with that lady and

then I hoped it would just go away." Sgt. Burke asked McCOWEN if he felt better having told police about his involvement. McCOWEN stated he has been hiding "this [REDACTED] since it happened and it's been an "up and down battle." McCOWEN stated that he did feel better, but also felt he was going to be "screwed". I asked McCOWEN why he felt that way and he stated, "Don't ask."

59. I asked McCOWEN why JEREMY would want to kill WORTHINGTON, when she had never met him before or knew him. McCOWEN stated, "Probably pissed her off cause she was calling 911. He's got to stop her from talking on the phone." I asked McCOWEN if he knew for certain that WORTHINGTON was trying to call 911. McCOWEN stated "I'm sure JEREMY must have seen her going for the phone and ..." McCOWEN stated that he did not want to be blamed and then stated "JEREMY did do it. JEREMY is the one who done this." McCOWEN stated "I got my piece of [REDACTED] I'm fine....that's on him. I'm the innocent one here." McCOWEN then stated, "JEREMY is going to say he didn't do it and wasn't there."

60. McCOWEN then offered that he saw JEREMY take something from the house and that JEREMY had thrown a black shirt wrapped around something in the back seat of his car when he came out of WORTHINGTON's house. McCOWEN stated that he did not know what the item was and never asked JEREMY about it and had no idea where it went.

61. MCCOWEN then explained again that he never spoke with JEREMY about this night. McCOWEN stated that he felt bad about what happened to WORTHINGTON but was in a "Catch-22". I asked McCOWEN what the Catch -22 was. McCOWEN stated, "If I had sex, then JEREMY can say he wasn't there."

62. I asked McCOWEN to tell me how he knew that JEREMY killed WORTHINGTON. MCCOWEN then stated that he would tell me what had happened. McCOWEN stated that both he and JEREMY walked up to WORTHINGTON's door. McCOWEN stated that "someone" knocked on the door. McCOWEN stated that he then spoke with WORTHINGTON. I asked McCOWEN what he said and he stated "Blah, Blah, Blah I don't remember. McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON invited him in and that he introduced JEREMY to WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated that he introduced JEREMY as "Wu" and that WORTHINGTON had asked JEREMY why they call him WU. I asked McCOWEN what JEREMY's answer was and he did not recall. McCOWEN stated that he then told JEREMY he could go ahead and leave

and come back in a little while. McCOWEN said that JEREMY decided to stay and that he (McCOWEN) and WORTHINGTON then went to the living room where they spoke a little and then had sex on the floor. I asked McCOWEN what he and WORTHINGTON had talked about and he said, "Just Blasé, Blasé". McCOWEN stated that he could hear JEREMY going through WORTHINGTON's office while he was having sex. McCOWEN stated that he and WORTHINGTON got dressed after having sex and that WORTHINGTON noticed JEREMY coming out of the office. MCCWOEN stated that WORTHINGTON asked JEREMY what he was doing and that JEREMY said he was just checking out the house. McCOWEN stated that he told WORTHINGTON to call him and that he and JEREMY then left the house. McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON then came out of the house and started "yelling and bitching" at JEREMY. MCCOWEN stated that JEREMY then turned around and "gave her two quick pops straight to her face." McCOWEN stated he told JEREMY [REDACTED] lets go". McCOWEN stated that JEREMY hit WORTHINGTON "a few more times" and that WORTHINGTON then ran to the house. McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON entered the house, but did not close the door and that JEREMY followed her inside. McCOWEN stated that he remained outside and that he could hear "lots of things knocked over inside." McCOWEN stated that JEREMY then came out of the house towards the driver's side of JEREMY's vehicle. McCOWEN stated that he thought about leaving on foot but decided it was to far to walk back to Eastham. McCOWEN stated that he then saw WORTHINGTON at the front door with a phone and WORTHINGTON was "starting to dial". McCOWEN stated that he told JEREMY that she was calling the police. McCOWEN stated that FRAZIER said, "The [REDACTED] she is." and that he ran back to the house and kicked in the now closed front door.

63. I told McCOWEN that his story didn't have a ring of truth to it and that he had still not explained to me how he knew that JEREMY had killed WORTHINGTON. McCOWEN stated, "No I didn't do it. I got kids of my own. There were two people there, I'm not the killer." McCOWEN said it was "understandable" that Sgt. Burke and I thought he killed her, but he only had sex. I told McCOWEN that I believed he still had more of the story to tell me. Sgt. Burke told McCOWEN the same thing.

64. McCOWEN then stated, "It was a mistake". I asked McCOWEN what was a mistake. McCOWEN said, "I didn't mean for us to go up there and do what I did. You know." McCOWEN then stated, "After he hit her I started firing onto her." McCOWEN then explained that if JEREMY was in a fight, he was going to be in the same fight alongside his friend. McCOWEN stated that after JEREMY hit

WORTHINGTON he "automatically fired on her". McCOWEN described hitting WORTHINGTON once in the chest and once in the face. McCOWEN said that maybe that was how his DNA was on WORTHINGTON's body. McCOWEN stated that JEREMY grabbed WORTHINGTON under the arms after they knocked her out and dragged her inside the house. McCOWEN stated that JEREMY dragged WORTHINGTON and that he (McCOWEN) helped JEREMY get her inside the kitchen. McCOWEN stated that both he and JEREMY went inside the kitchen. McCOWEN then stated, "Her little daughter was still asleep inside, I don't know." McCOWEN stated that JEREMY then "did it". McCOWEN said that he and JEREMY then wiped WORTHINGTON's body down with dishtowels that they found in the kitchen. I asked McCOWEN where those towels went and he stated that JEREMY got rid of them and that he did not know how or where. McCOWEN stated that on the stove there was a butcher block knife holder and that JEREMY took a kitchen knife out of the holder. McCOWEN stated that he stood in the kitchen and watched as JEREMY stabbed WORTHINGTON once in the chest. I asked McCOWEN where WORTHINGTON had been stabbed and he pointed to his mid chest, just to the left of his mid line. McCOWEN stated, "The knife came out clean, It wasn't like we got blood all over us" McCOWEN stated that he and JEREMY then got into JEREMY's car and then left to go to [REDACTED] McCOWEN stated that JEREMY made no stops, dropped him off and that he went to his bathroom, cleaned up and then went to sleep on the couch.

65. I asked McCOWEN if WORTHINGTON was unconscious when she was dragged inside her home. McCOWEN stated that she was. I asked McCOWEN where he punched her. McCOWEN stated once in the face and "one quick poke in the chest". I asked McCOWEN to tell me more about the dishtowels. McCOWEN stated that they were some rags from the stove area. I asked McCOWEN why he wiped the body down and he stated that he did not know. I asked McCOWEN about the knife. McCOWEN estimated the knife blade length to be approximately eight inches and described it as a "regular kitchen carving knife".

66. McCOWEN then stated, "I never meant for that lady to get killed. It a nightmare after nightmare and not a day goes by that I don't think of it." McCOWEN stated, "Ya, I had sex with her. Ya, I beat her ass, but it was JEREMEY that stabbed her." I then asked McCOWEN what he and JEREMY had said afterwards. McCOWEN stated that he and JEREMY have never spoken. I asked McCOWEN what WORTHINGTON had been wearing when she was punched outside. McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON was wearing black sweatpants and a black sweatshirt. I told McCOWEN that I did not believe that JEREMY was there

based upon information that JEREMY was giving Troopers in Truro. McCOWEN stated, "I don't know how you can tie JEREMEY in."

67. I asked McCOWEN to review the timeline of the incident. McCOWEN stated, "This how it went down". McCOWEN stated that he gave directions to go to Truro and that JEREMY drove him to WORTHINGTON's. McCOWEN stated that when they arrived they sat for a moment in JEREMY's car and McCOWEN told him, "We're not going to be here long." McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON was "startled to see us." McCOWEN said that he then told WORTHINGTON something like, "I'm tipsy I just wanted to get some [REDACTED] McCOWEN said, "She was cool with it." McCOWEN said that he and WORTHINGTON then had sex and he could hear JEREMY "banging around" in the office. McCOWEN said that WORTHINGTON confronted JEREMY about being in her office and that JEREMY denied being in her office, saying he had been in the kitchen. McCOWEN stated he had to believe JEREMY. McCOWEN said, "This is my boy, this is just somebody I'm [REDACTED] McCOWEN said that he and JEREMY then began to leave. McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON followed them out and was saying, [REDACTED] this and that". I asked McCOWEN what she said exactly and he stated that he couldn't remember. McCOWEN stated that WORTHINGTON was trying to be quiet and "yelling but like a whisper." McCOWEN stated that JEREMY was yelling back at WORTHINGTON, "[REDACTED] you bitch" and calling her "a stupid [REDACTED] McCOWEN stated, "JEREMY lost it and I just followed suit. It was pandemonium" McCOWEN stated that after WORTHINGTON was down, "we put the boots to her." McCOWEN stated that I had said earlier that there was green grass in WORTHINGTON's hair and that was wrong because her head hit the gravel driveway. McCOWEN said, "I still can hear her hit that ground, she hit the ground hard." McCOWEN said that JEREMY dragged WORTHINGTON under her arms. McCOWEN was unable to recall if WORTHINGTON had shoes or socks on, but did recall she had "black sweatpants". McCOWEN said, "Next thing I know he pulls out a knife from the block." McCOWEN stated that he stood there and watched as JEREMY stabbed her in the kitchen hallway area. McCOWEN motioned to his chest again as he described the stab. McCOWEN said there was no blood from the knife or stab wound that he could see. McCOWEN stated that when they left the house he left first and that JEREMY was right behind him. McCOWEN stated that when they reached JEREMY's car he noticed that JEREMY had a black shirt which had a knife, a purse and a phone wrapped up in it. McCOWEN stated that he saw JEREMY toss the shirt in the rear seat of his car. I asked McCOWEN how he knew what was in the shirt. McCOWEN stated that he had seen JEREMY wrap the items up and that he did not know where JEREMY got them. I asked McCOWEN why JEREMY

took these items and he stated that he did not know. I asked McCOWEN where the t-shirt came from and he stated that he did not know.

68. I asked McCOWEN what had happened to the items in the rear seat. McCOWEN stated that he did not know. McCOWEN was asked if JEREMY stopped anywhere as they left the house. McCOWEN stated that they did not stop and he did not see JEREMY do anything else with the black T-shirt. McCOWEN said he has never asked JEREMY about those things.

69. I asked McCOWEN about the phone he saw and asked if it was a cell phone or house phone. McCOWEN stated that he did not notice. I reminded McCOWEN that earlier he said he saw WORTHINGTON on the phone and that he remembered her "starting to dial". I asked McCOWEN when he saw that and McCOWEN stated that he could not remember.

70. At approximately 12:15 A.M. McCOWEN stated to me that he watched C.S.I. and NYPD Blue and that he knew that [REDACTED] that do these things always call for a lawyer and said that he had not done that and he was cooperating and that he didn't murder WORTHINGTON. I told McCOWEN that I appreciated him talking to me, but felt his story wasn't true. McCOWEN stated that he felt he should let his lawyer know he was going to be in court in the morning. I asked McCOWEN if he wanted to call and speak with his lawyer. McCOWEN stated that he wanted to call [REDACTED] but did not have his number. I then allowed McCOWEN to use the phone and he contacted Attorney [REDACTED]. McCOWEN made a call and indicated to me that he was done with the call and stated that he left a message with his Attorney. I instructed McCOWEN to sit on the bench in the booking area and advised him that he would now be booked and printed prior to being placed in a cell. McCOWEN stated that he was not done talking and wanted to clear everything up. I advised McCOWEN that he could wait until after actually talking with his lawyer. McCOWEN stated that he had left a message for his lawyer and was all set. I explained to McCOWEN that I wanted to be clear on the issue of his attorney and asked him if he wanted his attorney present or did he want to keep talking without his attorney. McCOWEN stated that he would keep talking saying, "It beats being in a cold cell". McCOWEN then walked back into the conference room.

71. At this time I excused myself from the interview in order to speak with Troopers who had information regarding the interview of FRAZIER in Truro. Sgt. Robert Knott, Massachusetts State Police

Detectives and Sgt. Burke continued to speak with McCOWEN regarding a photo that was located at his residence. See report of Sgt. Burke.

72. I returned to the interview and informed McCOWEN that as a result of the interview with JEREMY it seemed that there would be other people police that the police could speak with to verify JEREMY's whereabouts on that Friday night. I told McCOWEN that JEREMY seemed to recall the night and that JEREMY said he was at a party in Eastham that night and not with McCOWEN in Truro. McCOWEN stated that he understood and that he was not trying to be disrespectful but he was telling what had happened.

73. At approximately 12:40 A.M. Sgt. Burke advised McCOWEN of his Right to Prompt Notification and Arraignment. McCOWEN signed and executed the waiver at 12:50 A.M.

74. Sgt. Burke advised McCOWEN that he had described many of the things that investigators suspected had happened at WORTHINGTON's house that night. Sgt. Burke told McCOWEN that he believed that McCOWEN had been at WORTHINGTON's house alone and that JEREMY had never been there. McCOWEN stated that JEREMY was there. Sgt. Burke stated that FRAZIER was not the one with anger management issues. McCOWEN stated, "I have no issues." McCOWEN was asked about [REDACTED] McCOWEN stated that [REDACTED] and he had only had verbal arguments and never physical ones. I asked McCOWEN about [REDACTED] McCOWEN stated that he had an argument with [REDACTED] about his getting his things out of her house and was holding [REDACTED] car door when she suddenly backed up causing the door to break. I asked McCOWEN about [REDACTED] McCOWEN said, "That bitch? I didn't touch her." I asked McCOWEN about [REDACTED] McCOWEN stated, "I never touched [REDACTED]"

75. At approximately 1:15 A.M. McCOWEN then asked if he could use the phone again to call his girlfriend [REDACTED] provided McCOWEN with the phone on the table. McCOWEN dialed the number and I heard him tell the person on the other end, "Hey, They got me for that murder." McCOWEN then listened and added "In Truro". McCOWEN spoke with [REDACTED] some time and then asked me [REDACTED] could bring a cell phone to the barracks so he could scroll through the directory to find a number he needed. I told him she could and McCOWEN gave me the phone and I gave [REDACTED] directions to the barracks. This

officer is aware that [REDACTED] arrived later (2:15 A.M) during booking and was allowed to provide McCOWEN with the phone number he needed.

76: Both Sgt. Burke and I continued to tell McCOWEN that we believed he had not given us an accurate version of the events that evening. McCOWEN stated, "I told you everything". McCOWEN also said that we could test the knives and his car. McCOWEN stated, "If you did it, you wouldn't tell me." McCOWEN indicated that he was not going to change his story and that we could sit here all night and nothing would change. At that time, 1:35 A.M. Sgt. Burke and I decided to end the interview and begin the booking procedure. McCOWEN was notified that the bail commissioner had been contacted and that there was no bail and he would be transported to Orleans District Court in the morning.
