Confidence Holds Flat


Consumer confidence treaded water this week, failing to extend last week's advance.

The ABC News/Money magazine Consumer Comfort index, based on Americans' ratings of current economic conditions, stands at -11 on its scale of +100 to -100, unchanged from last week.

The index rose four points last week, after steadily dropping to -15 the week of Aug. 11, its lowest since April 1996.

The ABC/Money index is made up of ratings of the economy, buying climate and personal finances. Worst are ratings of the economy. Just 33 percent of Americans say the economy's in good shape; it's been as high as 45 percent this year in March.


Forty-one percent say now's a good time to buy things, four points below it's 2002 high. Far better are personal finance ratings. Fifty-nine percent of Americans say their own finances are OK, four points off its peak this year.

TREND – The ABC/Money index started the year at -13 and improved to +1 in March and mid-April. It slipped to -5 in late April and then held steady between -4 and -7 until July. In the face of corporate scandals, the declining stock market, and disappointing economic reports, the index dropped from -8 on July 14 to -15 on Aug. 11, before improving to -11 last week.

The index's all-time high was +38 in January 2000; its record low, -50 in February 1992. Its lifetime average in weekly polls since December 1985 is -8.

GROUPS – As usual, confidence is higher among better-off Americans. The index is +7 among people in higher-income households compared to -27 in the lowest, -1 among college graduates while -31 among high-school dropouts, -9 among whites but -29 among blacks and -2 among men while -21 among women.

Here's a closer look at the three components of the ABC/Money index:

NATIONAL ECONOMY – Thirty-three percent of Americans rate the nation's economy as excellent or good, unchanged from last week. The best was 80 percent Jan. 16, 2000. The worst was seven percent in late 1991 and early 1992.

PERSONAL FINANCES – Fifty-nine percent rate their own finances as excellent or good, down one point from last week. The best was 70 percent, set Aug. 30, 1998 and last matched in January 2000. The worst rating was 42 percent on March 14, 1993.

BUYING CLIMATE – Forty-one percent say it's an excellent or good time to buy things they want and need, up one point from last week. The best was 57 percent Jan. 16, 2000. The worst was 20 percent in fall 1990.

METHODOLOGY - The ABC News/Money magazine Consumer Comfort Index represents a rolling average based on telephone interviews with a random sample of about 1,000 adults nationwide each month. This week's results are based on 1,011 interviews in the month ending August 25, 2002 and have an error margin of plus or minus three percentage points. Field work by ICR-International Communications Research of Media, Pa.

The ABC/Money index is derived as follows: The negative response to each index question is subtracted from the positive response to that question. The three resulting numbers are then added and divided by three. The index can range from +100 (everyone positive on all three measures) to -100 (all negative on all three measures). The survey began in December 1985.
