A Sunny August For Consumer Confidence

It was a sunny August for consumer confidence – a tie for the second-best month on record in the 14-year-old ABC News/Money magazine poll.

Seventy-six percent of Americans say the economy's in good shape, up six points since early July and four points from its record high. Sixty-nine percent rate their own finances positively, one point from its high. And 53 percent call it a good time to buy things.

Confidence was its best on record in January, then lost ground before its August resurgence. The past month ties March 1999 for the second-best on record since this weekly poll began in December 1985.

INDEX – The ABC News/Money magazine Consumer Comfort Index, based on these ratings, stands at +32 on its scale of +100 to -100, down one point from last week. The index has averaged +32 in August, five points above its average over the four preceding months. January's mark of +34 stands as the all-time high.

The index has averaged +29 this year, a point above its record 1999 average. Its lifetime average, depressed by recession in the early 1990s, is only -10.

GROUPS – As usual, confidence is higher among better-off Americans: The index is +63 in higher-income households compared to -18 in the lowest, +47 among college graduates but +1 among high-school dropouts, +37 among whites but +3 among blacks and +43 among men but +22 among women.

Here's a closer look at the three components of the ABC/Money index:

NATIONAL ECONOMY- The poll asks: Would you describe the state of the nation's economy these days as excellent, good, not so good or poor? Seventy-six percent say excellent or good, down one point from last week. The record, 80 percent, was set on Jan. 16, 2000. The worst rating was seven percent in late 1991 and early 1992.

PERSONAL FINANCES - The poll asks: Would you describe the state of your own personal finances these days as excellent, good, not so good or poor? Sixty-nine percent say excellent or good, the same as last week. The record, 70 percent, was set Aug. 30, 1998 and last matched in January. The worst was 42 percent on March 14, 1993.

BUYING CLIMATE - The poll asks: Considering the cost of things today and your own personal finances, would you say now is an excellent time, a good time, a not-so-good time or a poor time to buy the things you want and need? Fifty-three percent say excellent or good, down one point from last week. The record, 57 percent, was set Jan. 16, 2000. The worst rating, 20 percent, was set in fall 1990.

METHODOLOGY - The ABC News/Money magazine Consumer Comfort Index represents a rolling average based on telephone interviews with about 1,000 adults nationwide each month. This week's results are based on 1,054 interviews in the week ending Aug. 27 and have an error margin of plus or minus three percentage points. Fieldwork by ICR-International Communications Research of Media, Pa.

The ABC/Money index is derived as follows: The negative response to each index question is subtracted from the positive response to that question. The three resulting numbers are then added and divided by three. The index can range from +100 (everyone

positive on all three measures) to -100 (all negative on all three measures). The survey began in December 1985.
