

## **Early Criticism of Clinton Wins Praise for Lieberman**

Joseph Lieberman wins big points from the American public for his early criticism of Bill Clinton in the Monica Lewinsky affair, a sign that selecting Lieberman for vice president could help Al Gore defuse some of the Clinton fatigue that's dogged his campaign.

Seventy-two percent in an ABC News Good Morning America poll think more favorably of Lieberman when they're told he was one of the first Democratic lawmakers to criticize Clinton publicly. It's Lieberman's most positive attribute of four tested in this survey.

Lieberman's Orthodox Jewish faith, meanwhile, is a non-issue for sizable majorities; indeed 53 percent regard it as a positive attribute, compared to 17 percent negative. The largest concern, expressed by 29 percent of the public, is that he might seek to influence policy toward Israel based on his religious beliefs rather than on U.S. interests.

Overall, 60 percent approve of the choice, even though two-thirds don't know enough about Lieberman yet to have formed a favorable or unfavorable opinion of him. These numbers were almost identical for Republican vice presidential nominee Dick Cheney when he was selected a week and a half ago.

In the end the selection of a vice president is unlikely to make or break any presidential campaign; it's the top of the ticket that drives the vote. Seventy-three percent in this poll say Gore's choice of Lieberman won't make any difference in their vote; 77 percent said the same of Cheney.

**SO, HE'S JEWISH** – Eighty-nine percent say they're not concerned that Lieberman's faith would interfere with his duties as vice president. And 83 percent say they would vote for a Jewish candidate for vice president, same as in a poll 17 years ago; 10 percent said they wouldn't. (That's not a precise question, since people don't vote solely for v.p.)

More broadly, just six percent of Americans say that, honestly assessing themselves, they have "some feelings of prejudice against Jews." Self-reporting is not necessarily a weak gauge; in a similar question on black-white relations last year, 34 percent reported "some racist feelings."

ATTRIBUTES – Of the attributes tested in this poll, Lieberman's weakest is his vote to keep late-term or "partial-birth" abortion legal; 51 percent think less favorably of him for it. But just 15 percent feel that way strongly.

By contrast, 72 percent think favorably of his criticism of Clinton, and 40 percent feel that way strongly; 71 percent think favorably of his 12-year tenure as a U.S. senator from Connecticut; and 53 percent respond favorably to his being an Orthodox Jew (including equal numbers of white Protestant and white Catholic respondents.)

Conservatives and Republicans are disproportionately critical of Lieberman's vote on late-term abortion. But these the same groups have the most praise for Lieberman's criticism of Clinton on the Lewinsky scandal: Nearly nine in 10 Republicans and 83 percent of conservatives respond favorably; so do more than seven in 10 independents and moderates. That declines to about six in 10 Democrats and liberals alike.

METHODOLOGY – This ABC News poll was conducted by telephone Aug. 7, 2000, among a random national sample of 513 adults. The results have a 4.5-point error margin. Field work by TNS Intersearch of Horsham, Pa.
